

#### Job Title: Prospect Researcher and Manager

## **Job Highlights**

The Prospect Researcher and Manager serves the fundraising/Philanthropy team of 15 front-line fundraisers at Houston Grand Opera, by identifying potential donor prospects (individuals, corporations, and foundations), and examining their philanthropic propensity toward greater giving to Houston Grand Opera. As the sole researcher for the Philanthropy fundraising team, the Prospect Researcher and Manager gathers and distributes information that allows each fundraiser to choose the best possible approach for cultivation, engagement, and solicitation strategies for potential donors. With the Senior Director of Philanthropy, the Prospect Researcher and Manager is also responsible for continually and consistently identifying new and prospective partners, investors, and supporters, for the work of Houston Grand Opera. These new and prospective partners, investors, and supporters are to be identified among a local, state-wide, and national pool beyond the current base of Houston Grand Opera donors, subscribers, and ticket purchasers.

# **Key Responsibilities**

- Using a wide array of sources, researches, organizes, and evaluates a prospective donor's financial capacity, ability to give, willingness to give, charitable interests, and connection to Houston Grand Opera.
- Among a local, state-wide, and national pool, that is distinctive from the current base of Houston
  Grand Opera donors, subscribers, and ticket purchasers, continually and consistently identifies new
  and prospective partners, investors, and supporters, for the work of Houston Grand Opera. Creates
  and deploys a system for sharing information on these new and prospective partners, investors, and
  supporters, with Office of the General Director, Philanthropy and the Board of Directors Philanthropy
  Committee, and/or other members within Houston Grand Opera who may benefit with connection.
- Prepares in-depth reports and narratives on prospective donors by mining data from the donor database and other sources that aid in qualifying prospective donors.
- Provides consistent portfolio management for Philanthropy officers by administratively charting next steps, in conjunction with Philanthropy officers, with any given donor. Meets quarterly with each Philanthropy officer, and their supervisor, for overall portfolio review, and to ensure that each portfolio remains dynamic in its potential. Participates in processes and procedures to ensure the quality and consistency of tracking of prospect engagement and solicitations.
- Creates and devises a system for optimizing potential giving by ranking donors for upgraded giving
  opportunities, and prospective donors for increased and major gift giving opportunities. Works with
  each fundraiser in the Philanthropy team to ensure that each fundraiser is dedicating time and
  energy to those donors who may allow for the greatest financial impact for Houston Grand Opera.
- Conducts research on Special Events table guests for Opening Night, Concert of Arias, and Opera Ball, and provides research to Philanthropy officers one week in advance of the event.
- Creates profiles of HGO travel participants for their review prior to travel.
- Reviews local and national news and business publications, keeping abreast of prospect information as well as local and regional business developments.
- Develops a standard format for donor profiles and ensures that each donor of \$1,000+ has that profile attached to Tessitura donor record.
- Serves as department liaison with electronic screening vendors, and as department expert on its utilities, analyses, and management of data.
- Other duties as assigned.

### Qualifications



Bachelor's degree required, and a minimum of one year of demonstrated experience in prospect research, preferably in nonprofit fundraising, is preferred. Knowledge of the range of resources available to prospect researchers and the ability to apply those resources in an organized manner is preferred.

#### Other Skills and Abilities

Demonstrated analytical skills for identifying philanthropic patterns and relationships for individual, corporate and foundation donors. Ability to analyze documents, such as financial documents, and public records, for the purposes of wealth assessment. Outstanding computer skills. Excellent and demonstrated writing skill. Excellent interpersonal skills and the demonstrated ability to work independently, while managing competing obligations toward meeting deadlines. Strong project management and problem-solving skills. Ability to maintain confidentiality and work with sensitive data. Must be able to thrive in a highly-productive, fast-paced environment. Requires some night and weekend work.
